

RULES AND REGULATIONS HAMILTON ISLAND MARINA

1. Requirements of the Craft. Only craft in seaworthy condition and under their own power will be admitted to the Marina.

All craft must be registered, identified, marked, equipped and maintained as required by law and safe practice from time to time.

2. Storage and Mooring Space. Any craft in the marina is under the jurisdiction of the Licensor and shall be manoeuvred and berthed where directed by the Marina Manager or representative. Wet berths space will be assigned by the Marina Manager or his representative and no change can be made by the Licensee.

3. Mooring Lines. The Licensee shall at his expense supply and fit suitable mooring lines and maintain them in good order and condition. The Licensor reserves the right to repair or replace such lines at the Licensee's expense if in the opinion of the Marina Manager or representative the lines are too small or are in poor condition or could lead to damage being occasioned to property or injury to persons.

4. Tidiness of Licensed Premises. The Licensee shall keep the licensed premises in an orderly and clean condition. Piers, walkways and other areas of the Marina must be kept clear of all gear including dinghies or skiffs.

5. Condition of the Craft. The Licensee shall keep the Craft in such condition that it does not become unsightly or dilapidated or reflect unfavourably on the appearance and the standards of the Marina Facility. Decks of all craft shall be kept free and clear of debris, bottles, papers, garbage or unsightly material.

6. Conduct. Neither the Licensee nor his invitees shall engage in disorderly or indecent conduct on or about the Marina.

7. Noise. Noise shall be kept to a minimum at all times and the Licensee shall not create a nuisance by the use of television, radio, musical apparatus or any other form of sound reproduction.

8. Garbage. Refuse, garbage and plastic bags are not to be thrown overboard, but must be placed in the garbage bin provided. Toilets, oils, spirits, inflammable and oily bilges must not be discharged into the waters of the Marina.

9. Swimming. Swimming, diving, or fishing within the Marina is prohibited.

10. Children. Children should be accompanied by adults at all times and must wear life jackets when in small boat or near the water.

11. Pets. Animal pets are only permitted in the Marina onboard vessels if they do not disturb other persons are taken on a leash promptly to and from the craft. The Licensee shall be responsible for promptly cleaning up any droppings of any pets brought to the Marina.

12. Laundry. Laundry of any kind or any item of a personal nature shall not be hung out to dry or air in public view aboard any craft or any part of the marina.

13. Speed Limit. A speed limit of 4 Knots and no wash is to be observed within the Marina and when entering or departing the Marina. When entering the Marina, observe standard procedures – always keep to the right.

14. Delivery of Goods. The Licensee will use and permit to be used for the receipt delivery or other movement of any goods, wares or merchandise only such parts of the Marina and at time as the Marina Manager may from time to time permit.

15. Access. The Licensor shall endeavour, but shall not be obliged, to grant licensee's access to the Marina 24 hours per day seven days a week.

16. Dangerous and Explosive Goods. The Licensee shall not bring nor shall he be permitted his invitees to bring any dangerous goods onto the Marina, the Licensed Premises or the Craft whilst it is situated near or upon the Marina. Boats are not to refuel via fuel can whilst in the Marina or Licensed Premises refuelling to be undertaken whilst at the provided refuelling station.

17. Vacating Mooring or Storage Space. The licensee shall notify the Licensor when the Craft is to be absent from the Licensed Premises for more than 24hrs and the Licensor shall be entitled to use the Licensed Premises during such period.

18. Identification. All boats must display decals for identification purposes in a location that can be seen from the wharf or berthing finger.

19. Trolleys. At no time are the marina trolleys to be removed from the Marina or Licensed premises.

20. Berthing. All vessels berthing period will be from 11am to 11am unless prior arrangements have been made with the Marina Office.

21. Bow Sprits. Bow sprits or anchors are not to protrude over walkways.

22. Works. A vessel owner, invitee or contractor may not engage or conduct any works that may cause pollution (noise, air-born etc) or any construction works or spray painting at their marina berth.
